Must be a pregnant or postpartum woman, with an infant or child up to age 5; must meet income guidelines; must live in Massachusetts. TAFDC, MassHealth, or SNAP (Food Stamps) participation makes WIC eligibility automatic. Grandparents with custody of their grandchildren may apply, as well as foster parents. Proof of income, proof of birth date, and proof of residency is required. Attleboro, Mansfield and Taunton WIC appointments and intakes are currently being done over the phone, 508-823-6346.
